## Primary PE and Sports Funding

Each school is allocated a sum of money called the Primary PE and Sports Funding to support all children and improve the quantity, quality and breadth of PE and sports provision. This allocation is calculated according to the intake number of the school, and the school must decide how best to use the money to improve its provision of PE, including increased participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.
